Our Ref: Rauri Hardy Complaint

Dear Members,

We write further to our complaint submitted to this Committee on 18 July 2024 (enclosed), where we politely requested, 'Please can we trouble you for a response no later than 31 July 2024'.

To date, two months following, we remain waiting on a response from the Committee. Please may we ask, when a police complaint is submitted to the Committee for initial assessment, is it standard procedure not to contact the Complainant(s) and fail to secure evidence and information, for over two months?

Please may we also ask:

- Is the Committee not of a mind to believe that allegations of the Chief Officer of Guernsey Police lying (multiple times and publicly) not important enough to look into, within two months?
- What action has the Committee taken in response to our complaint?
- What action does the Committee intent to take in response to our complaint?

We think our allegations are very serious. We have been advised by serving police officers that if a police officer was found making a 'false statement with a dishonest intent', as it the case here, it would result in instant dismissal. Furthermore, Mr Hardy has, preceding our complaint, been accused of perjury – lying under oath – on two or maybe three occasions. We were also told 'the more senior the officer the more serious the complaint'.

We believe all these complaints show a pattern of misconduct. At least something to be looked into?

We took legal advice in order to learn whether there are any civil claims which can be brought against Deputy Prow as an individual or Committee Members as individuals, in addition to separate to claims under Human Rights Legislation. But advisers think we would have to bring claims against the States of Guernsey, not Deputy Prow or Committee Members, which we do not think is fair. Others Deputies are in no way to blame for what the Committee *for* Home Affairs gets up to.

Please could we trouble you for a response, including a reply to our questions above, no later than 4 October 2024.
